The National Institutes of Health's (NIH) Roadmap Epigenomics Program is pleased to announce that a Poster Session will be part of the *Emerging Evidence for Epigenomic Changes in Human Disease Conference* on Monday, March 16, 2009. The purpose of the Poster Session is to create an opportunity for attendees to present their research and technology to their peers, to foster discussions that may lead to collaborations, and to identify potential research partners. This is not an exhibit or tradeshow, but is instead an opportunity to share information.

CALL FOR POSTERS

Poster abstracts will be reviewed by the planning committee for the Emerging Evidence for Epigenomic Changes in Human Disease planning committee. Several abstracts will be selected for short ten minute talks during the general session of the conference.

Please indicate on the Registration Form if you will be presenting a poster. This will ensure adequate poster display area. Also indicate if you would like to be considered for an invitation to speak.

1. General Information

During the Poster Session presenters will display their non-proprietary scientific findings of their research. Poster presenters will be expected to stand by their poster during the Poster Session and should be available to discuss their research.

The Poster Session will be held in the Atrium at the Natcher Conference Center on Monday, March 16, 2009 from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.

2. Abstract Submission

- Only ONE abstract per attendee will be accepted.
- Please let us know if you would like to be considered to share this information as a speaker.
- Abstracts are due by Friday, February 27, 2009 by email to SHolbrook@seiservices.com.

3. Abstract Preparation Instructions

Organize the body of the abstract as follows:

- State objectives of the study (preferably one sentence)
- Discuss the methods used

- Summarize the results in sufficient detail to support the conclusion
- Provide the conclusions
- Limit to one page.

4. Additional Information for Abstracts

- Please review your abstract carefully before submitting. NIH is not responsible for correcting typographical, spelling, or grammatical errors.
- Abstracts will be reproduced and included in the Program Book and distributed during the conference.

5. Additional Information on Posters

- Make your poster as self-explanatory as possible. The poster should attract attention, provide a brief overview of the research or evaluation, and encourage the initiation of questions and discussion.
- Posters should be no larger than 4' high by 6' wide.
- Tables and charts should be easy to understand and include short captions.
- Color may be used for highlighting and to make the posters more visually attractive.
- The text should summarize important information.
- Information on posters should be large enough to be viewed from 4 feet away.

Additional poster information such as set-up times and poster numbers will be provided at a later date.
